- Provide barristers and chambers' personnel with the information and skills they need to stay well
- Support members of the profession through difficulties that affect their professional life
- Help those responsible for or who are supporting those in difficulty or crisis

To encourage Chambers, as well as organisations that employ Barristers, to share good practice and ideas for wellbeing initiatives, the Bar Council is offering a Certificate of Recognition to Chambers and organisations which develop wellbeing initiatives, policies and programmes for barristers and staff. It is hoped this Certificate will assist Chambers and organisations in demonstrating their commitment to barrister and staff wellbeing.

To get a Certificate of Recognition, you must have a wellbeing initiative in place, and be prepared to share your experience on the WATB portal.

Your policy, practice or initiative will be considered by the Wellbeing at the Bar Working Group which is made up of representatives of the Bar Council, the Inns of Court, the Circuits, Specialist Bar Associations, the IBC and the LPMA.

Eligibility

The certificate of recognition represents a profession-wide appreciation for the work of Chambers and employers of barristers, as well as Inns, SBAs, Circuits, the IBC and LPMA in:

- developing a wellbeing policy; or
- increasing awareness of wellbeing; or

- developing resilience training schemes e.g. mentoring or coaching schemes; or
- promoting wellbeing initiatives e.g. yoga or mindfulness sessions or sponsored runs etc.
