



HOW TO EXHIBIT

The Pupillage Fair is the only fair run by the Bar, for the future Bar. Last year's Fair attracted a record of 680 students, 54 exhibitors, and over 150 volunteer barristers.

In response to feedback, this year's Fair will:

- Take place at a venue with better exhibitor space and larger rooms for sessions;
- Include targeted sessions on specific practice areas;
- Offer exhibitor space dedicated to specific practice areas;
- Be co-designed in association with Specialist Bar Associations, and
- Involve more targeted marketing to students.

Each exhibition stand costs **£670 plus VAT**, and includes:

- One exhibitor table;
- Able to display pull up banners at your stand;
- Three exhibitor places, and
- Catering for up to exhibitors.

An additional charge of **£200 + VAT** to include an A4 leaflet/literature in the Pupillage Fair delegate bags.

Free exhibition stands

We have a limited number of pro bono spaces available, but aim to provide space to those pupillage providers and organisations that would otherwise be unable to comfortably afford exhibitor space. We will consider applications for pro bono spaces until 5pm on Friday 29 June 2018, and give priority to:

- a. Registered charities or not for profit organisations, provided they are relevant to aspiring barristers;
- b. Pupillage providers that receive grants from the Council of the Inns of Court Pupillage Matched Funding Scheme;
- c. Pupillage providers who will incur a significant travel cost in getting to the Pupillage Fair.

- d. Pupillage providers who undertake a significant amount of pro bono and/or publicly funded work; and
- e. Newly established pupillage providers.
