Pupillage Gateway: Report

September 2022

The General Council of the Bar, known as the Bar Council, is the Approved Regulator of the Bar of England and Wales, and the representative body for the profession. It discharges its regulatory functions through the independent Bar Standards Board (BSB). The Bar Council currently represents approximately 17,000 practising barristers in England and Wales.

The Pupillage Gateway is a recruitment portal owned by the Bar Council and used by Authorised Education and Training Organisations (AETOs) to advertise vacancies and recruit aspirant barristers for pupillage (paid training opportunities) at the Bar. The Pupillage Gateway is currently used to recruit – rather than advertise only – by approximately half of all AETOs at the Bar. Those AETOs who do not use Gateway tend to manage their own recruitment process directly. The Pupillage Gateway is used by aspiring barristers who seek to apply for pupillage vacancies. To apply for pupillage, candidates must be confident that they will have completed the vocational component before the advertised date of commencement or have sought (and had approved) a waiver for such from the Bar Standards Board. To start pupillage, applicants must have completed the vocational component within the last five years, unless they have a waiver from the BSB. In a typical year, over half of applicants apply for pupillage having not yet completed the vocational component. We estimate that 60-70% of all applicants for

pupillage use the Pupillage Gateway to make at least one application.² Between 450-600 pupil barristers start pupillage each year, though 2020/21 saw a reduction compared to previous years.³ This reduction may be at least partly due to the impact of the pandemic.

As the only central source of information on pupillage recruitment at the Bar, the Pupillage Gateway is a valuable source of data on the profiles of candidates and pupillage vacancies, as well as the progression of candidates in recruitment for those Authorised Education and Training Organisations (AETOs) that recruit using the Gateway platform.

The Bar Council is, in this report, sharing selected data sets to improve the transparency of the information we share about the profession and identify areas where further guidance and support for candidates and AETOs might be needed. This report should be seen as a companion to the Bar Standards Board's annual BPTC Key Statistics Report.⁴

It should be noted that the most recent Gateway process combines AETOs who were recruiting (in early 2022) for pupils to start in Autumn 2022, and other AETOs recruiting for pupils to start in Autumn 2023. In terms of advertised vacancies, in any given recruitment round, there tend to be more vacancies for a year in advance than vacancies for the same year.

The key points emerging from the analysis are:

- The number of pupillages offered on the Gateway appears to have recovered post-pandemic to 486 in total, reaching similar levels to those offered in 2019/20
- The total number of applicants during the 2021/22 recruitment round was 2,782, representing virtually no change compared to the 2020/21 recruitment round
- The number of applicants per Gateway advertisement appears to be steady after a peak of 11.9 applications per Pupillage Gateway vacancy. For vacancies advertised to commence in 2022/23, it increased by 5.6 per cent to 11.4 applicants per vacancy, compared to 10.8 applicants per vacancy advertised to commence in 2021/22
- There is nothing to suggest that those who have not studied law at undergraduate level are at a disadvantage in attaining pupillage

- Academic qualifications are the most significant indicator of successful pupillage applications. Candidates with a first-class degree were 2.4 times more likely to receive an offer as compared to those who attained upper second-class honours; 1 in 4 candidates who obtained Outstanding at the vocational level received an offer of pupillage as compared to 1 in 10 who obtained Very Competent
- Applicants with a scholarship from one of the Inns of Court were three times more likely to receive an offer of pupillage than those without

Data notes

Section A: Vacancies

Subject only to a small number of specific waivers, all AETOs must comply with the same pupillage offer timetable, and all AETOs are required to advertise their pupillage vacancies on the Pupillage Gateway.⁵ However, it remains open to AETOs to carry out their own selection process outside the Gateway and, with the exception of the information that is contained within their advertisements, the Bar Council does not hold any data in respect of the relevant recruitment processes.

We hold relevant data on all vacancies from the content of the advertisements, and, specifically, the number of posts advertised, the specialism, location, pupillage award etc. This does not always translate to the number of offers that are made, particularly for those AETOs not using the Pupillage Gateway to recruit. Please note that total vacancies are aggregated across different recruitment rounds to demonstrate the number of pupillages advertised through the Gateway for any given pupillage start year. This data represents vacancies, it does not represent final numbers of pupils who start in any given year.

Additionally, AETOs may change their main practice area year to year, so we can only make limited comparisons about change over time in relation to practice area. Where possible, we have compared the most recent complete figures from the previous Pupillage Gateway report.⁶

We do not hold data relating to AETOs that have made a successful advertising waiver, for either a full or partial pupillage, neither do we have complete data on how many pupillages are successfully recruited each year. Therefore, the total pupillages offered through the Pupillage Gateway will differ from the figure for total pupillages registered that is published by the Bar Standards Board (BSB).⁷

Section B: Applicants

This report will include any candidates who applied to AETOs on the Pupillage Gateway during the 2021/22 recruitment round (i.e., between January 5 and February 9, 2022). Since the implementation of the mandatory timetable, candidates are highly likely to make at least one application through the Pupillage Gateway, given approximately half of AETOs use the Gateway to recruit each year.

In terms of analysing to which AETOs candidates apply, we only hold data on those AETOs who use the Pupillage Gateway to recruit. Section B2 does not apply to those AETOs who only use the Pupillage Gateway to advertise, not to recruit.

Section C: Outcomes

This data is not comprehensive and comes with several caveats (see below). The Bar Council has therefore drawn only tentative conclusions on the basis of the available data.

- 1. This data only relates to those AETOs that use the Pupillage Gateway to facilitate their respective recruitment processes, and the candidates that applied to them through the system. Between November 2021 and May 2022, this translated to 122 AETOs advertising 309 pupillages (of a total of 202 AETOs advertising 499 pupillages).
- 2. All but five of the relevant AETOs responded to our emails requesting clarification of their 'Bar Council Areas of Practice'. The numbers of responses received were as follows and as should be clear from the figures, it should be noted that some AETOs opted to appear under more than one category:

- 3. The 'First Round', 'Second Round' and 'Offer Made' data is likely to be slightly comprised as we know that some AETOs fail to properly update the status of their candidates.
- 4. Any oddities in the data between 'Second Round' and 'Offer Made' will be the result of one or more AETOs only running 'First Round' interviews, meaning that the successful candidates do not appear in the 'Second Round' column and instead jump to 'Offer Made'.
- 5. We have omitted data sets in this section which have low engagement (i.e., those in which 50 per cent or more of candidates selected 'Prefer not to say').

Section A: Vacancies

Summary

- The number of pupillages advertised to start during the financial year 2022/23, stands at 486 (compared to 490 in 2019/20 and 421 in 2020/21). This suggests that vacancies may have recovered to pre-pandemic levels
- All practice areas saw an increase in the number of vacancies advertised to start during the 2022/23 financial year compared to 2020/21

A1: Number of vacancies

- 1. Based on the number of pupillages aggregated by start date, the total number of pupillage positions advertised between 2016-2020 remained very broadly stable, between 459 and 497.8
- 2. In 2020/21, the number of pupillages *advertised* decreased by 14.1 per cent compared to the previous year. The BSB reported a 35 per cent decrease in the number of pupillages *registered* in 2020 compared to the previous year.⁹ Note that the decrease in registrations is likely to reflect the fact that some pupillages, which were offered and accepted, were then deferred. The reduction of advertised may be at least partly due to the impact of the pandemic.
- 3. By contrast, the number of pupillages advertised to start during the financial year 2022/23, stood at 486 (compared to 490 in 2019/20), which suggests that vacancies have recovered to pre-pandemic levels.
- 4. All practice areas saw an increase in the number of pupillages offered that start in the financial year 2022/23, compared to those advertised to start in the financial year 2021/22. However, please note that we are not able to make long-term comparisons. Comparison can be made between the figures for vacancies advertised to commence in 2022/23 and those that were included in the 2021 report.¹⁰
- 5. Some Circuits saw a small decrease in the number of pupillages advertised to start in 2022/23, while other Circuits saw a small increase.

Section A2: Average pupillage award across practice areas

- 6. The average pupillage award advertised across different practice areas has remained relatively stable over the last six years.
- 7. In 2019, the pupillage award was raised from a minimum of £12,000, to the wages recommended by the Living Wage Foundation. This increases year on year.
- 8. We are not able to use historical data to make comparisons. ²¹ However, we can make comparisons between the most recent year of complete data as recorded in the previous Pupillage Gateway report and compare it to this year's most recent complete figures.

Section B: Candidates and applications

Summary

- The number of applicants per Pupillage Gateway position peaked in 2020/21 and appears to be on the rise again after a low for Pupillage Gateway vacancies advertised to commence in 2021/22
- The total number of pupillage applicants who submitted one or more applications during the 2021/22 recruitment round is 2782, an increase of just 0.4 per cent compared to the 2020/21 recruitment round
- Compared to the 2020/21 recruitment process, the percentage of applicants who have no debt has increased by 8.4 per cent and the percentage of applicants with debt of over £60,000 has increased by 16.2 per cent. Over half of those who responded to this question have debt levels over £30,000

9. This shows that over half of all applicants who responded to this question have debt of £30,000 or more. The average total personal debt per adult in the UK in 2021 was approximately £32,000. 23

B2: Number of applications per pupillage offered

- 10. This data has limited reliability and comes with several caveats (see <u>Data notes</u>, pp. 2-4). The Bar Council has therefore made limited conclusions on the basis of the available data.
- 11. This only applies to vacancies on the Pupillage Gateway, we do not hold data on those who recruit off-Gateway. The data has been aggregated by pupillage start date, not by any particular recruitment round.
- 12. This data only relates to those AETOs that use the Pupillage Gateway to facilitate their respective recruitment processes, and the candidates that applied to them through the system. Between 25 November 2021 and 9 February 2022, this translates 499 pupillages across 202 Authorised Education and Training Organisations ("AETOs") (compared to 404 across 176 during the 2020/21 recruitment round).
- 13. The total number of applicants during the 2021/22 recruitment round was 2771, compared to 2782 in 2022/23.
- 14. The number of unique applicants per Pupillage Gateway position has been steadily increasing each year. The only exception is the 2021/22 recruitment round, where there was a slight decrease in the average number of applicants compared to the 2020/21 recruitment round. This does not include any AETOs who do not recruit through the Gateway.
- 15. The total number of applicants per Gateway vacancy for 2023/24 will likely be impacted when next year's adverts are included (i.e., when additional pupillages are recruited in the 2023/24 recruitment round to start in the 2023/24 financial year). ²⁴

Section C: Outcomes

Summary

- We have not included data sets here for protected characteristics or indicators of socio-economic background³⁵ where 50 per cent or more have answered 'Prefer not to say'
- These figures include candidates who applied during the recruitment round running between November 2021 and May 2022, in line with the mandatory timetable. These will include candidates who applied for pupillages to start during the financial year 2022/23 and during the financial year 2023/24
- Limited conclusions can be made from this data, as we have not controlled for e.g., higher education institution, degree class, or BPTC grade. In general:
 - A slightly higher proportion of women (9.6 per cent) than men (9.4 per cent) received an offer of pupillage. This has changed from 2021 where a higher proportion of men rather than women received an offer of pupillage
 - 13.1 per cent of White (British/English/Welsh/Northern Irish/Scottish) candidates secured pupillage compared to 5.1 per cent of Asian/Asian British and 3.6 per cent of Black/African/Caribbean/Black British
 - Applicants without a disability were more likely to receive an offer of pupillage than applicants with a disability with the disparity larger in 2022 than in 2021. In 2022, 1.0 per cent fewer applicants with disability received an offer of pupillage and 1.9 per cent more applicants without a disability
 - Applicants from lower socio-economic backgrounds were less likely to receive an offer of pupillage (using parental occupation or free school meals as a metric)
- Candidates with a first-class degree were 2.4 times more likely to receive an offer as compared to those who attained upper second-class honours
- 1 in 4 candidates who obtained Outstanding at the vocational level received an offer of pupillage as compared to 1 in 10 who obtained Very Competent
- There is no evidence that candidates who do not study law are less likely to receive an offer of pupillage
- Applicants who had received a scholarship were more than 3 times more likely to receive an offer of pupillage
- As was the case in 2021, candidates are most likely to be successful after completing one to three rounds of pupillage applications

Section C1: Number of years applied

The largest group of applicants are those applying for the first time, making up 45.4 per cent of the total applicants. Among this group, about 1 in 10 receive an offer as compared to those applying for the first time in 2021 where it was 1 in 20 received an offer. The likelihood of success increases each additional year of application, peaking for those who apply for the fourth time to about 1 in 6 applicants. There is also a high chance of success when applying for the eighth year, though this represents a very small sample size.³⁶

It is not possible to be certain about the explanation for these figures. It could be a case that those who reapply use the year (or more since the first application) to improve their qualifications and enhance their experience. It could also be true that they become better at the application process, or they have spent more time tailoring their applications to AETOs who are more likely to accept them.

This report does not address variation in success of application by area of practice, as data limitations make this information unreliable.³⁸

Section C3: Protected Characteristics

Where there are fewer than five respondents in any given group, this has been suppressed to prevent identification. There are instances where either higher numbers or 0 may be suppressed where numbers less than 5 may otherwise be identifiable.

Limited conclusions can be made from this data, as we have not controlled for e.g., higher education institution, degree class, or BPTC grade.

Across all practice areas, fewer men applied for pupillage than women. Of those applicants who stated their sex:

• 37.0 per cent were men and 57.5 per cent were women. There is a decrease of 1.0 per cent in male applicants as compared to 2021. The number of women applicants has remained steady with no shift

A higher proportion of women received an offer of pupillage across different practice areas:

- 9.6 per cent of women received offers compared to 9.4 per cent of men across all practice areas. In 2021, there were more men who received offers (8.8 per cent) compared to 7.1 per cent of women. In 2022, 2.5 per cent more women have received offers
- In Chancery, 4.5 per cent of men received offers compared to 3.1 per cent of women. As compared to 2021, there are 0.2 per cent less men who have received offers and an increase of 0.1 per cent for women
- In commercial, 6.0 per cent of men received offers compared to 4.3 per cent of women. As compared to 2021, there are 0.3 per cent more men who have received offers and an increase of 0.8 per cent for women
- In crime, 3.6 per cent of men received offers compared to 5.7 per cent of women. As compared to 2021, there are 1.1 per cent less men who have received offers and an increase of 2.3 per cent for women
- In family, 4.4 per cent of men received offers compared to 5.3 per cent of women. As compared to 2021, there are 0.6 per cent less men who have received offers and an increase of 1.9 per cent for women
- In general civil practice, 4.6 per cent of men received offers compared to 4.9 per cent of women. As compared to 2021, there are 0.1 per cent less men who have received offers and an increase of 1.0 per cent for women

• In mixed practice, 5.4 per cent of men received offers compared to 5.1 per cent of women. As compared to 2021, there are 1.5 per cent more men who have received offers and an increase of 1.4 per cent for women

Across all practice areas:

- 43.7 per cent of applicants identified their ethnicity as white (British/English/Welsh/Northern Irish/Scottish), this was 46.9 per cent in 2021
- 9.7 per cent are white (Irish/Gypsy or Irish Traveller or any other white background) which is the same as in 2021.

- In Chancery, 5.2 per cent of white (British/English/Welsh/Northern Irish/Scottish) candidates received an offer of pupillage, which is 0.9 per cent more than 2021 compared with 1.8 per cent of ethnic minority candidates (2.8 per cent in 2021).

- In commercial, 6.6 per cent of white (British/English/Welsh/Northern Irish/Scottish) candidates received an offer of pupillage, which is 1.5 per cent more than 2021 compared with 2.7 per cent of ethnic minority candidates (3.8 per cent in 2021).
- In crime, 7.1 per cent of white (British/English/Welsh/Northern Irish/Scottish) candidates received an offer of pupillage, which is 2.2 per cent more than 2021 compared with 2.7 per cent of ethnic minority candidates (2.7 per cent in 2021).
- In family, 6.9 per cent of white (British/English/Welsh/Northern Irish/Scottish) candidates received an offer of pupillage, which is 1.1 per cent more than 2021 compared with 2.9 per cent of ethnic minority candidates (1.8 per cent in 2021).
- In general civil, 6.7 per cent of white (British/English/Welsh/Northern Irish/Scottish) candidates received an offer of pupillage, which is 1.3 per cent more than 2021 compared with 2.4 per cent of ethnic minority candidates (2.9 per cent in 2021).
- In mixed practice, 6.9 per cent of white (British/English/Welsh/Northern Irish/Scottish) candidates received an offer of pupillage, which is 1.7 per cent more than 2021 compared with 3.2 per cent of ethnic minority candidates (2.1 per cent in 2021).

When looking at ethnic groups across all practice areas, white candidates are most likely to achieve pupillage (13.0 per cent) which is an increase of 4.1 per cent from 2021. This is followed by Asian/Asian British (5.1 per cent in 2022 and 5.0 per cent in 2021), and Black/African/Caribbean/Black British (3.6 per cent in 2022 and 2.5 per cent in 2021).

Across all practice areas, 11.5 per cent of applicants (9.9 per cent in 2021) said they had a disability and 79.3 per cent (82.2 per cent in 2021) said they did not have a disability.

- 6.3 per cent (7.3 per cent in 2021) of applicants with a disability received offers compared to 10.0 per cent (8.1 per cent) of applicants without a disability across all practice areas.
- In Chancery, 3.2 per cent (2.3 per cent in 2021) of applicants with a disability received offers compared to 3.8 per cent (3.9 per cent in 2021) of applicants without a disability.
- In commercial, 3.0 per cent (1.9 per cent in 2021) of applicants with a disability received offers compared to 5.2 per cent (4.8 per cent in 2021) of applicants without a disability.
- In crime, 4.0 per cent (5.2 per cent in 2021) of applicants with a disability received offers compared to 5.1 per cent (4.0 per cent in 2021) of applicants without a disability.
- In family, 2.7 per cent (4.6 per cent in 2021) of applicants with a disability received offers compared to 5.3 per cent (4.2 per cent in 2021) of applicants without a disability.

- In general civil, 2.5 per cent (4.9 per cent in 2021) of applicants with a disability received offers compared to 5.1 per cent (4.3 per cent in 2021) of applicants without a disability.
- In mixed practice civil, 3.8 per cent (5.2 per cent in 2021) of applicants with a disability received offers compared to 5.4 per cent (3.8 per cent in 2021) of applicants without a disability.

Across all practice areas, 12.7 per cent (11.0 per cent in 2021) of candidates identified as lesbian, gay, bisexual or another non-heterosexual term, and 74.7 per cent (78.5 per cent in 2021) of candidates identified as heterosexual.

Out of all applicants, 67.2 per cent (75.1 per cent in 2021) of heterosexual candidates obtained an offer of pupillage, compared to 15.3 per cent (15.6 per cent in 2021) of lesbian, gay, bisexual, or other non-heterosexual sexualities.

Section C4: Outcomes based on social mobility

- Limited conclusions can be made from this data, as we have not controlled for e.g., higher education institution, degree class, or BPTC grade
- The Social Mobility Commission breaks parental occupation into three groups: professional backgrounds, intermediate backgrounds, and lower socio-economic backgrounds³⁹
- Across all practice areas, 11.4 per cent (9.5 per cent in 2021) of those from professional backgrounds achieved pupillage, compared to 10.3 per cent (7.3 per cent in 2021) from intermediate backgrounds and 6.5 per cent (5.9 per cent in 2021) from lower socio-economic backgrounds
- Across all practice areas, 10.5 per cent (8.7 per cent in 2021) of candidates who were not eligible for Free School Meals received offers of pupillage compared to 6.3 per cent (5.5 per cent in 2021) of candidates who were eligible for Free School Meals

Section C5: Outcomes based on education

- Limited conclusions can be made from this data, as we have not controlled for e.g., higher education institution
- 16.4 per cent (14.6 per cent in 2021) of candidates with a first-class degree received an offer of pupillage compared to 6.8 per cent (5.4 per cent) of candidates with an upper second-class degree
- 8.0 per cent (6.4 per cent in 2021) of candidates with a law degree secured pupillage, compared to 13.3 per cent (11.6 per cent in 2021) of those who did not study law
- 25.7 per cent (20.8 per cent in 2021) of candidates who had achieved Outstanding in their BPTC or equivalent vocational component course secured an offer of pupillage, compared to 10.3 per cent (10.5 per cent in 2021) who had achieved Very Competent and 3.0 per cent (2.1 per cent in 2021) who had achieved Competent
- 9.7 per cent (7.4 per cent in 2021) of candidates who had not yet completed their BPTC or equivalent vocational component course secured an offer
- 18.0 per cent (16.3 per cent in 2021) of candidates who were in receipt of a scholarship from one of the Inns of Court secured an offer of pupillage compared to 5.6 per cent (4.0 per cent in 2021) of candidates who did not have a scholarship. Therefore, candidates with a scholarship were 3.2 times more likely to secure pupillage compared to 4 times in 2021. This might be because the Inns selection process for scholarships is selecting for the same characteristics as AETOs are looking for, or because holding an Inn scholarship in and of itself predisposes AETOs in favour of those candidates, or that both factors are in play
