The Bar Council is looking to nominate a barrister representative for the Incorporated Council of Law Reporting (ICLR).

About ICLR

ICLR, a registered charity and a company limited by guarantee, was formed in 1865. Its main objective is:

'The preparation and publication, in a convenient form, at a moderate price, and under gratuitous professional control, of Reports of Judicial Decisions of the Superior and Appellate Courts in England.'

The ICLR publishes The Law Reports, the Weekly Law Reports, the Industrial Cases Reports and the Consolidated Index in print and online, and the Business Law Reports and the Public and Third Sector Law Reports online.

The Council is composed of two representatives each from Inner Temple, Middle Temple, Gray's Inn, Lincoln's Inn, The Law Society and the General Council of the Bar plus the President of The Law Society, the Attorney-General and the Solicitor-General ex officio, and up to five co-opted Members.

About the role

The full Council meets once a year, at the July Annual General Meeting and Council Meeting which follows it. An Executive Committee oversees the business of the Council, for which the Chief Executive Officer is responsible and supported by a Senior Management Team.

The nominee would also be welcome to support the Council in other ways such as at ICLR events.
